THE VISION

Dean Gillian Lester's vision for student and community life at Columbia Law School calls for the development of a world-class educational environment with more space to teach, learn, and come together as a community. In order to deliver on this goal, we must enhance our learning spaces and provide students with a modern and functional setting in which to study, convene, and collaborate.

This planned renovation of the Arthur W. Diamond Law Library will represent one of the single largest capital investments in the history of Jerome L. Greene Hall. The project entails a total redesign of three floors of Jerome L. Greene Hall—nearly 50,000 square feet.

The new vision for the library's learning spaces:

- Provides a mix of individual and group study environments.
- Increases seating capacity by up to 70 percent.
- Offers state-of-the-art resources for teaching and learning, with the technology to facilitate collaboration.
