
JD Guidelines for completing the Certificate of Attendance section of the NYS Bar Examination Application

The applicant's study of law at an ABA approved law school must satisfy the eligibility requirements of Section 520.3 of the NY Rules of the Court of Appeals. Therefore, applicants will need to answer specific questions about the number of credits they completed in various types of offerings, including professional responsibility, clinical coursework, field placement programs, and externships.

While completing the Certificate of Attendance section, applicants should review the following:

- 2. Transcript via Degree History in Lawnet
- 3. Degree Requirement Status (DRS) in <u>Lawnet</u>




