

COURSES/SEMINARS WITH ANTICIPATED HIGH DEMAND

To maximize your chances of being assigned your most desired classes in the lottery program, it might be helpful to know which 2016-17 courses had high demand and which had a wait list at the end of the Add/Drop period. Of course, it is impossible to predict which courses actually will have high demand in any given term. Most seminars have a limit of 18 registrants while lecture courses normally have a larger enrollment. If you are interested in any of these classes, you should consider listing them as your first or second choice and assigning lower priority to other courses.
